

Christ in Prophecy
Revelation 13: “Larry McCoy Singing Revelation: Part 2”

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Opening

Dr. Reagan: Thirty years ago, a young man in Tennessee was led by God to put the entire book of Revelation to music. That remarkable album continues to this very day to touch the souls of people all over the world. I invite you to stay tuned as we interview Larry McCoy, and hear samples of the incredible songs he wrote which incorporate the exact words of the book of Revelation.

Part 1

Dr. Reagan: Greetings in the name of Jesus, our blessed hope. And welcome to Christ in Prophecy. My special guest again this week is Larry McCoy from Gallatin, Tennessee. Welcome to our program, Larry.

Larry McCoy: Well thank you so much Dave.

Dr. Reagan: Last week you said being from Gallatin makes you a Galatian.

Larry McCoy: That's right.

Dr. Reagan: Okay well that's a good deal, that's biblical. Now last week Larry told us the story of how God led him to put the entire book of Revelation to music. And folks, that was exactly 30 years ago in 1978 and his album contains to this day to impact people all over the world. That's because of course, the message his songs contain is eternal in nature. Now last week Larry blessed us with a number of his songs dedicated to expressing the messages contained in the first four chapters of Revelation. Chapter 6-18 though focus on the great Tribulation, and appropriately, the songs for these chapters

are rather heavy in nature, often featuring a great bass voice. Tell us Larry, I counted and I think there's 27 different songs on this album including the songs of the seven churches. And which of those 27 do you like the best?

Larry McCoy: I tell you, that is a tough one. I love chapter one, "And when I saw him I fell down at his feet." I mean every time it just makes cold chills.

Dr. Reagan: We got it last week, yeah.

Larry McCoy: "Behold I stand at the door and knock..." And in 21 He says, "He that overcometh will inherit all creation, I will be his God and he shall be my son." You can't beat that message!

Dr. Reagan: Well, I tell you, my favorites are the first and the last.

Larry McCoy: Alpha and omega, yeah.

Dr. Reagan: They really are.

Larry McCoy: Mine too. You know it's just really hard to pick any one particular one.

Dr. Reagan: But I think when you got to that last chapter God gave you a very special anointing, cause it's like the ending of a Beethoven concert or something. I mean, it is spectacular!

Larry McCoy: Well thank you for those kind words, I appreciate it.

Dr. Reagan: It really is something and we're gonna tell our viewers how they can get a hold of that album at the end of this program, because I want as many people as possible to get copies of that album because as I know, as we say here in Texas, it's gonna bless their socks off, okay?

Larry McCoy: Amen.

Dr. Reagan: Now what I'd like to do right now is to jump from the beginning of the book to the end of the book.

Larry McCoy: Amen.

Dr. Reagan: And have you start with chapter 19, the chapter about the return of Jesus Christ in glory and majesty. To come back to this earth and reign over this earth, that the earth may be filled with truth, and you know, peace righteousness and justice as the waters cover the sea.

Larry McCoy: Amen.

Dr. Reagan: So would you be willing to sing chapter 19 for us?

Larry McCoy: Absolutely. Hallelujah.

Dr. Reagan: Okay brother, then folks, here is Larry McCoy singing chapter 19, about the return of Jesus Christ on that majestic white horse.

Part 2

Dr. Reagan: Thanks Larry for that incredibly rendition of chapter 19. I can hardly wait for that day! Now what is so exciting to me is that I believe the signs of the times indicate that we are living right now in the season of the Lord's return. We can't know the date, but I think the Bible indicated that through signs we can know the season. What about you? Do you think we're living in the season of the lord's return?

Larry McCoy: Absolutely.

Dr. Reagan: What would you convince you of that?

Larry McCoy: God will not be mocked, and on every hand we see the world mocking God. But there are indications that the remnant is being stirred by the Ruach Hakodesh.

There is an awareness of who we are in Christ through Hebrew roots from my discovery. And the signs of the time point to all the prophetic words in the Old Testament in what's called the nevi'im of the prophets. And it would be very difficult not to overlook. I believe, here's the way I believe it. I believe that God opens our eyes and senses by the Ruach Hakodesh that the time is at hand for us to motivate ourselves to do what God created Dave Reagan to do prior the foundation of this earth, and he's doing it. Hallelujah. And God bless you for that Dave, with all the vigor that God has given you. And right now, I ask God, God continue to manifest yourself miraculously in Dave Reagan's life so that this man of God can fulfill the prophecy that you have given him.

Dr. Reagan: Well, brother, that work God's given me is to proclaim the soon coming of Jesus and when I see God regathering the Jews from the four corners of the earth, re-establishing Israel, putting them back in Jerusalem, bringing all the nations of the world against them. I know we are living in the very threshold of the Tribulation.

Larry McCoy: And from a body of Christ standpoint, the awareness of their heritage in Christ is being re-awakened and the Ruach Hakodesh is bringing that remnant together.

Dr. Reagan: Absolutely.

Larry McCoy: And that is another manifestation of God's early return.

Dr. Reagan: Well I'm anxious to get to the Good news of the book of Revelation, and that good news not only is the return of Jesus but it has to do with His glorious Millennial reign which is outlined in chapter 20. And I want to ask you to sing that song for us.

Larry McCoy: Amen.

Dr. Reagan: Well folks, here's Larry McCoy, singing Revelation chapter 20.

Part 3

Dr. Reagan: Larry there are few chapters in the Bible that have been abused any more than the one you just sang, chapter 20. And that's because people just tend to spiritualize it to death, into meaninglessness, by saying it doesn't mean what it says. What about you? Do you believe chapter 20 means what it says?

Larry McCoy: Absolutely. I'm one of those fellows that fall into the camp that it's the glory of God to conceal the thing, but it's the honor of kings to search it out. And without believing that God's Word is inerrant, the original Scriptures, I'm lost I don't have a rudder. But I'm one of those guys that believe that what he said, he means. And chapter 20 is exactly what it says, I believe.

Dr. Reagan: Well, I do too and I just hate for people to spiritualize scripture. People spiritualize the beginning of the Bible, they spiritualize the end of the Bible. Those two portions in particular. They don't mean what they say. But you know when it comes to Bible prophecy, Larry, every one of the prophecies about the first coming of Jesus meant what they said. So, you don't have to be a space scientist to figure out that if they meant what they said, surely the Second Coming ones mean what they say!

Larry McCoy: Absolutely, hallelujah.

Dr. Reagan: And, if they don't mean what they say, then what do we know what they mean? You know, I think the reason people love to spiritualize is because when you start spiritualizing, you become God, because you can make it mean whatever you want it to mean, instead of what it really says.

Larry McCoy: I say it like this, the Scripture is light and salt.

Dr. Reagan: Amen.

Larry McCoy: And we're trying to make it shadows and sugar.

Dr. Reagan: I like that, that'll preach. Well, let's go to chapter 21, now in chapter 21 we move into the eternal state, new heavens, new earth, glorious new bodies. Wow that's an exciting chapter!

Larry McCoy: Amen.

Dr. Reagan: And I think you put some exciting music to do.

Larry McCoy: Well hallelujah.

Dr. Reagan: How about singing it for us?

Larry McCoy: I would love to.

Dr. Reagan: Here's Larry McCoy singing Revelation chapter 21.

Part 4

Dr. Reagan: You know, Larry, when I first started studying Bible prophecy that chapter you just sang, chapter 21, is the one that astounded me the most cause I knew nothing about prophecy until the Holy Spirit started guiding me to study it. I'd always been taught I was gonna spend eternity in Heaven, chapter 21 says no. Heaven's gonna come to Earth. That God's gonna come down to the Earth and live in our presence and we'll be in new bodies on an earth. And that's exciting.

Larry McCoy: Amen.

Dr. Reagan: It'll be a perfected earth. And we're gonna have perfected bodies, I think I'm gonna have a little hair!

Larry McCoy: You look fine to me, Dave.

Dr. Reagan: Okay, okay. Well folks, we're ready now for the last chapter of Revelation, chapter 22, and this is a chapter that ends with the last words of Jesus spoken on this earth. They were not the words on the cross, rather they were the words He spoke to the apostle John 65 years after His death, burial, and resurrection when He returned to this

Earth and confronted John on the Isle of Patmos. His final words were, "I am coming quickly." Jesus left us with a wonderful promise that one day He would return and he would do so quickly like a flash of lightning, like the blink of an eye. So Larry, let's have you do it. Sing chapter 22 for us.

Larry McCoy: Amen.

Dr. Reagan: Okay folks, here's Larry wrapping it all up with chapter 22.

Closing

Dr. Reagan: Well folks that's our program for this week, I hope and pray that it has been a blessing to you, and I hope you will be back with us next week when we will once again be taking a look at some aspect of God's prophetic word.
